What Is a Fibreglass Pool Interior?

Fibreglass comes in two forms:

1. **Factory-made fibreglass shells** lowered into an excavation.
2. **Fibreglass laminates** applied inside concrete pools during renovations.

Both are non-porous, extremely smooth and quick to install.

Appearance & Features

- Sleek gelcoat finish
- Reflective, glossy water look
- Very smooth, comfortable feel
- Colour options include modern sparkles and marbles

Pros

- One of the **fastest installations** possible
- Easy-to-clean, non-porous surface
- Smoothest feel underfoot
- Lifespan **20–30 years** for quality shells
- Great for kids and family-friendly pools
- Low maintenance demands

Cons

- Shape options limited to manufacturer moulds
- Cheaper shells prone to osmosis blisters
- Colour fade is more common in older models
- Not ideal for very deep or custom-shaped pools

Chemical Sensitivity

Fibreglass is more forgiving than cement finishes, but high chlorine levels and very low pH can still damage the gelcoat over time.

Repair, Upgrade or Replace

- Gelcoat patch repairs possible
- Entire resurfacing with new fibreglass laminate available for concrete pools
- Re-gel coating can rejuvenate old shells
